Main concerns



❖ Macro context

- No overall M&E policy and guidelines
- Lack of indicators to monitor the implementation of the developmental approach in child welfare
- Fixation on outputs & justification of funding

❖ Agency level

- No organisational policies & guidelines for M&E
- Poorly crafted M&E plans to give direction for OVC programmes
- No budgets for M&E
- No indicators being tracked
- Bureaucratic organisational structures without M&E units

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Main concerns



- No expert staff to guide M&E, rather M&E function is embedded into agency programmes
- No M&E tools (e.g. computer-based software)

❖ Management

- Significant lack of M&E skills
- Inadequate knowledge of the developmental approach, indicator development
- Unequal commitment to M&E
- Non-participation of staff in M&E planning
- No utilisation focus

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Main concerns



❖ Staff

- High staff turnover, fatigue & high caseloads
- Non participation
- M&E function perceived to be peripheral
- Negative attitude towards M&E
- M&E perceived as a mechanism to monitor individual performance

❖ Training

- Focus on CPD i.e. enhancing professional skills other than M&E
- Targeted at managers (top, departmental & middle)

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Reality?!



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Main concerns



❖ Data collection, analysis & use

- No uniformity of data collected
- No mechanisms to ensure data integrity
- Collection of mainly, quantitative data at the expense of qualitative data
- No analyses of data collected
- No feedback on how data is being used to inform service delivery improvement

❖ Reporting

- Reporting structures designed for external purposes
- M&E is not topical in the reports
- One way reporting to government & funders without feedback
- Reporting on outputs that cannot transcend this level to incorporate outcomes and impact

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Framework for Monitoring & Evaluation



Impact

- Long term changes that result from the achievement of specific outcomes (e.g. poverty reduction, job creation)

Outcomes

- "medium-term results for specific beneficiaries that are the consequence of achieving specific outputs."

Outputs

- The tangible and measurable products or services delivered as a result of the activities

Processes

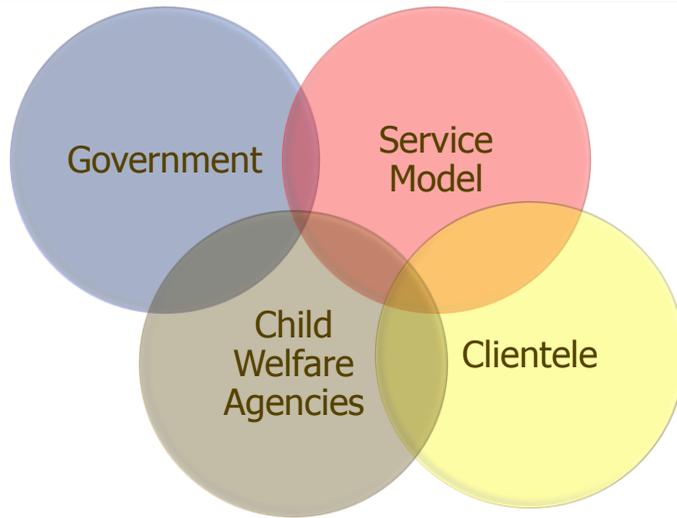
- The actions or activities that translate inputs into desired products

Inputs

- What is used to do the work in a project or a programme

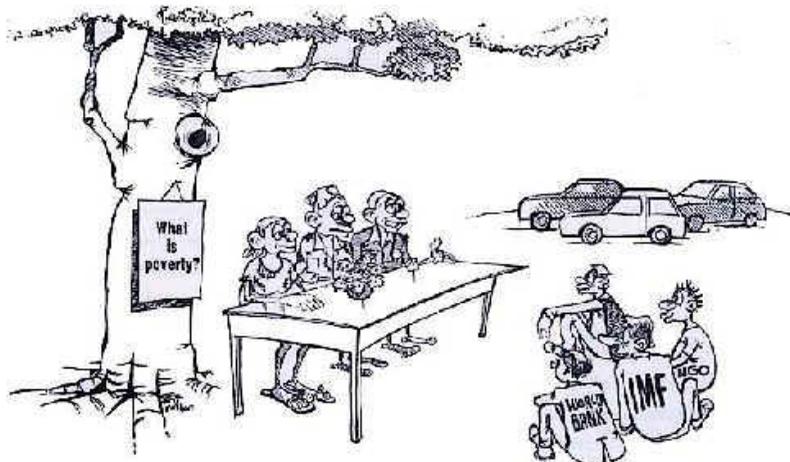
The Case for M&E in Child Welfare

Recommendations



- ❖ Develop M&E policies to guide how community-based services for OVCs are to be monitored and evaluated on the whole;
- ❖ Build capacity and ensure that appropriate training is offered for the implementation of M&E policies within the child welfare field;
- ❖ Develop a child welfare M&E system that provides the basis for M&E planning;
- ❖ Enhance cohesion between the DSD (funder/ policy maker) and the child welfare agency (policy implementer)
- ❖ Adopt participatory approaches in the design of data collection tools and strive for uniformity in the tools and data required on a monthly basis;

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Recommendations



- ❖ Allocate budgets for the child welfare agency to specifically finance the budget for M&E;
- ❖ Establish M&E units that are funded & have expert staff
- ❖ Channel resources towards the development of context-specific & efficient M&E tools
- ❖ Train social workers and social service professionals in evaluation research so that there can be a shift towards the evaluation of outcomes and impacts in the child welfare field;
- ❖ Align social work education to equip students with skills to effectively execute M&E duties in the workplace
- ❖ Develop indicators to measure overall performance & report on outcomes and impact
